

Evaluation of school's use of the new primary school sport funding.

How the funding has been spent: (Total received £5 700. Total expected £9 560)

School has used £3 252 buying in coaching from Ignite Sport.

Ignite Sport work across both Key Stages in Year's 2 – 6.

In KS1: multi skills lessons, athletics skills and gymnastics.

In KS2: hockey, tag rugby, football, athletics, gymnastics.

Ignite cover PPA across the Key Stages. We use a rota and teachers receive P.E. cover twice a year in two different terms ensuring the children receive lessons in a variety of sports. The timetable is planned and agreed before the start of term. Lessons take up one whole afternoon, once a week (2 hours)

Ignite run two after school clubs. The take up has not been huge in KS2 however in KS1 over the winter term they had 15 children.

Ignite have given the school a successful football tournament which allowed teachers non-contact time to write reports.

School has used £2 660 buying in specialist teaching from the Cherwell Partnership.

Kate Green – a primary and secondary trained PE teacher from Cherwell School teaches PE on Tuesday mornings.

Kate covers two classes to allow the teachers SLT/co-ordinator non-contact time.

Kate has taught netball, hockey, rounders, athletics and gymnastics.

We have used approximately £390 on transport to tournaments this year.

We have given sport a high profile in school over the last year.

The impact of the new funding on pupils.

Strengths:

Ignite - The children have benefited from having regular coaching in various skills. Ignite use a recognised teaching resource: LCP to deliver lessons.

Cherwell Partnership - Kate Green has delivered high quality PE teaching.

Areas for development:

Ignite – lack skills in managing large groups of children, not all of whom want to play sport.

Cherwell Partnership – have not been able to work with teachers to improve and continue their professional development. We have planned to change this in September so that class teachers receive PPD.

Transport – Minibus/car taxis are hugely expensive (our last bill was £140 for a sporting event in Abingdon – we took 12 children). We are limited to the amount of events we can attend because of this. School should consider fund raising for a minibus.

Sports field needs ground work done in September to stop the pitch flooding in bad weather. Quotation: If we repair the soil, back fill, level and seed the area the price is around £1300 excl VAT.
